BACKGROUND

In accordance with Section 6.16 of the *Local Government Act 1995*, a Local Government may impose and recover a fee or charge for any goods or service it provides or proposes to provide, other than a service for which a service charge is imposed. Fees and charges are to be imposed (generally) when adopting the annual budget and must be resolved by an absolute majority.

In determining the amount of a fee or charge for a service or goods a Local Government is required to consider the following factors (s 6.17) -

- (a) the cost to the Local Government of providing the goods or service:
- (b) the importance of the service or goods to the community; and
- (c) the price at which the service or goods could be provided by an alternative provider.

COMMENT

The attached fees and charges document reflect the proposed fees to be charged in 2023/2024. This document discusses the discretionary fees and charges only, as the Council does not have any control over legislative fees and charges. If any changes do occur after this date, then it will be incorporated into fees and charges and will be presented to Council for adoption with the budget.

The Consumer Price Index was 5.8% for the March 2023 financial year for the Perth Capital City Region. Taking this into account we propose an increase of approximately 5.8% on a portion of fees and charges in line with wage increases to the Modem Award Rates for the 2023/2024 financial year. Following a major review of all discretional fees and charges in 2022/2023, only seven (7) categories have been highlighted for increase.

The following fees and charges have been amended/increased/introduced for 2023/2024:

1. Housing

Pensioner Units - \$130 per week based on lease (Aligned with Centrelink's Rental Assistance Eligibility Requirements)

2. Waste Disposal

Refuse Removal (Charged via Rates Notice) – Domestic \$458, Commercial, and Industrial \$520, and Non-Rateable Property \$740.

3. Equipment Hire

Gymnasium Memberships:

Adult

- 1 Month \$35
- 3 Months \$70
- 6 Months \$110
- 12 Months \$200

Couple or Family - 2 Adults and 2 Children 12-17 Years of Age

- 1 Month \$60
- 3 Months \$120

Student (12 to 17) Must be accompanied by an Adult

- 1 Month \$25
- 3 Months \$40
- 6 Months \$55
- 12 Months \$80

Equipment Hire Delivery and Return – New charges have been introduced for the delivery and collection of hire equipment of \$175 per event and a penalty charge

of \$110 per event where the equipment is not presented appropriately for collection.

4. Accommodation, Caravan Parks, and Camping Charges

Overflow Camping (Overnight Only) – Unpowered Tent and Caravan (up to 2 persons) \$40.

5. Marine Facility Charges:

Monkey Mia Jetty Fees – Annual Fee \$95 per metre of vessel length. Daily casual berthing fee \$9 per day per metre of vessel length.

Jinker Fees - Haulage Fees - Monday to Friday (Excl. Public Holidays)
Slipway lift out \$320 per lift, Slipway lift in \$320 per lift, Slipway lift out with bow beam \$475 per lift, Slipway lift in with bow beam \$475 per lift, use of trailer for survey of vessel (no work) \$80 per hour or part thereof.

Jinker Fees - Haulage Fees - Outside of Normal Working Hours
Slipway lift out \$420 per lift, Slipway lift in \$420 per lift, Slipway lift out with bow beam \$530 per lift, Slipway lift in with bow beam \$530 per lift.

Jinker Travel - Travel Fee (Includes Tow Vehicle, Jinker, and Lead Vehicle with Operators), \$305 per hour or part thereof.

6. Building Supplies Charges

Materials – Brickies sand \$18, Gravel \$18, Pindan sand \$10, Crushed concrete \$30, Wood chips \$4, all per cubic metre or part thereof. A new charge of \$55 per hour loading fee has been introduced.

7. Engineering and Works Services

Private Works Crossover Reimbursement – 2 coat seal \$80, pavers, and concrete \$125, all per metre or part thereof.

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Section 6.16 of the *Local Government Act 1995* enables a Local Government to impose and recover a fee or charge for any goods or service it provides or proposes to provide.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

There are no policy implications associated with this item.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Fees and charges revenue will account for approximately 28 percent of the Shires operating revenue in 2023/2024 and provides a means for the Shire to recover the costs of providing services on a user pay basis.

STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS

Shark Bay Council is a strategically focused, unified Council, functioning efficiently. It is a transparent, resilient organisation demonstrating leadership and governance whilst engaging actively with the community and providing appropriate services to the community.

RISK MANAGEMENT

This is a low-risk item for Council. Council needs to set fees and charges to reduce the reliance on grant income and rates. Should Council not impose any fees and charges then there will be a need to increase rates to cover the shortfall. The community expect to pay fees and charges for the use of facilities and for the provision services.
